

Emergency number

The emergency number 112 is for emergency care only. For example, if you or someone else needs urgent medical attention. If there is a fire. Or if you witness a crime. For example, assault or burglary.

Drinking water in the Netherlands is of excellent quality. You can drink the water straight from the tap.

Testing emergency sirens

Every first Monday of the month at noon, the alarm system is tested outside. You will then hear the sound of the test alarm all over the street.

Register

Are you moving to the municipality of Moerdijk from abroad? Then register within 5 days of arrival. Make an appointment by phone at 14 0168 or online at afspraak.moerdijk.nl

Will you be staying in the Netherlands for longer than 4 months? Then register as a resident of the Netherlands.



Will you be staying in the Netherlands for less than 4 months? Then register as a temporary resident of the Netherlands. Make an appointment at the RNI in Breda by phone at 14 076 or online at www.breda.nl/verhuizen-en-registratie-niet-ingezetenen If you want to work in the Netherlands, you will need a Dutch Citizen Service Number (BSN). You will be given this number when you register.

Are you moving to the municipality of Moerdijk from abroad? Then register within 5 days of arrival. Make an appointment by phone at **14 0168** or online at <u>afspraak.moerdijk.nl</u>

Moving house

Are you moving from Moerdijk to another municipality or abroad? If so, report this to the municipality. You can do this – with your Digid – online at moerdijk.nl/verhuizing



Declaration of birth

Have you become a parent? Report the birth of your son or daughter within 3 days to the municipality where your child was born. This can be done online at moordijk.nl/geboorteaangifte

Passport/driving license renewal

Matters regarding your passport or driver's license can be arranged online at moerdijk.nl/paspoort or moerdijk.nl/rijbewijs

Waste

We separate waste in the municipality of Moerdijk. Vegetable and fruit waste, plastic, paper and residual waste are each collected separately. You can read about this in the waste guide: moerdijk.nl/afvalwijzer. You may not leave cans, bottles, plastic bags, etc. on the street or by the side of the road. Put them in a trash can.















DISCOVER THE MUNICIPALITY



The municipality of Moerdijk consists of 11 characteristic towns and is surrounded by water. It is a municipality of nearly 37,000 residents. As the crow flies, it is nearly 25 kilometers from Zevenbergschen Hoek to Willemstad. Moerdijk is the second largest municipality in North Brabant by area. The centers and villages in Moerdijk each have their own character. Some are agricultural, others urban or historic. In any case, each village has a friendly and welcoming atmosphere. We hope you enjoy and feel welcome in our municipality. If you need anything, we will be happy to help.

Leisure

In the municipality of Moerdijk, you can play sports at an association or at gyms. Sports can be played indoors or outdoors. You can swim indoors at De Niervaert in Klundert and at De Oester in Fijnaart. The outdoor pools are: De Bosselaar in Zevenbergen and Het Buitendiep in Willemstad.

There are also marinas for pleasure boats in Willemstad.

In Zevenbergen there is De Schuur theater and in Zevenbergschen Hoek there is a music school.

Thrift store

Thrift stores are Emmaus in Langeweg and Kringloop Mamas Huisraad in Zevenbergen. There are larger thrift stores in Breda, Etten- Leur and Roosendaal.

Covid-19

Healthcare

Family doctors

Ask your employer which family doctors they have made arrangements with. Or find a family doctor yourself. There are several family doctors and dentists in the municipality of Moerdijk; however, sometimes there are patient stops.



If you need to see a doctor urgently after 17:00, on weekends or holidays, please call the family doctor's office in Roosendaal (0165 – 530 200).



Social work

If you have personal questions or problems you want to talk to someone about, Surplus social workers will listen to and think with you. Their help is free of charge. You can come to them with issues such as: anxiety, depression, loneliness, health, grief or problems at work. Visit www.surplus.nl or call for an appointment at: 0168 - 33 13 57.

Hospitals

For urgent matters call 112, which is for police, fire and ambulance.

If you go directly to the hospital when it is not urgent, then you have to pay the healthcare costs yourself. A hospital may also refuse you.

There are nearby hospitals in Roosendaal, Breda, Dordrecht and Rotterdam. For specialty care from doctors in the hospital, you always need a referral from your family doctor.

Children

If you yourself work during the day, in the Netherlands you can have your child taken care of in a playgroup, daycare center or extracurricular care. Children between the ages of 5 and 16 are required to attend school. Once you are in the Netherlands, you must enroll your child in a school.

A playgroup is for very young children who are cared for there for a few hours a week. A daycare center is for children aged 0-4, parents can decide how often their child goes here.

The extracurricular care is care for children between the ages of 4-13. Here, the care is before, during and after school and during vacations. You can get an allowance for this from the Dutch Tax Office or the municipality.

Language

Curio

Are you from an EU country and want to learn Dutch? It's called NT2 (Dutch as a second language) and you take it at Curio. If you live within the municipality of Moerdijk, you will receive a government subsidy for this. You pay a co-payment of up to 100 euros per course. You can take the class in Zevenbergen.

At Curio in Breda and in Bergen op Zoom, there is the international transition class (ISK) for students 12 and older who do not yet have a sufficient command of the language. The emphasis here is on learning Dutch as a second language.

Library

At West-Brabant library (Kasteelweg 3 in Zevenbergen) you can read books or take a basic computer course. At the Taalpunt you can ask all your questions about learning the Dutch language, reading easy books or information about language, reading and learning.





Language consultation: every Thursday from 10:00 - 12:00

Language practice group: Monday afternoons 13:30 – 15:00 (sign up)

Language café: speaking Dutch together every Thursday: 13:30 – 15:00 (free walk-in).

Transport

To travel by public transport in the Netherlands, you need an OV-chipkaart (<u>ov-chipkaart.nl</u>). You can buy them at train stations, at Primera or at various supermarkets. You cannot buy individual train or bus tickets.



Applying for OV-chipkaart

The OV-chipkaart allows you to travel on all public transportation throughout the Netherlands. The OV-chipkaart can be purchased at train stations, in various stores and supermarkets, as well as online. More information on how to apply can be found at ov-chipkaart.nl or call: 0900-0980.



Train: There is a train station in Zevenbergen: ns.nl

Airport: There are airports in Amsterdam (Schiphol), Rotterdam/The Hague, Eindhoven, Maastricht and Groningen.



Travel planner (9292)

On the 9292 website, you can see how to get to your destination by public transport. Enter your current location and desired destination and the app will show you which bus, streetcar, or train to take 9292.nl 0900-9292 (€0.90/min).

Traffic

The Netherlands has strict rules on alcohol and drug use in traffic and the fines are high. You also put yourself and others in serious danger. There is a limit of 0.5 per mille. Driving under the influence of alcohol or drugs is a crime.

Vehicles must have a valid license plate, otherwise they may be taken off the road by the police. A foreign license plate allows you to drive around tax-free for a maximum of 6 months. If you are registered here, you must also register your car with the Rijksdienst voor het Wegverkeer (Dutch national road service) and have your license plate transferred to a Dutch license plate. Also, you then have to start paying road taxes. Sometimes a waiver is available through the Dutch Internal Revenue Service.



Insurance

If you live in the Netherlands and work at a Dutch company, you are required to have Dutch health insurance. Sometimes your employer or the employment agency will help you with this. If you are organizing your own health insurance, do so as soon as possible and in any case within four months after you start working here. You pay your own medical expenses during the period you are not insured.

Anyone who causes damage to another is financially liable for this. "Third-party vehicle insurance" is mandatory. Drivers of motor vehicles without third-party vehicle insurance are punishable.

Working

ID

In the Netherlands, you must always be able to identify yourself, including at work. Your employer will make a copy of your ID or passport. However, your employer must return it to you afterwards.

Dutch bank account

Your employer transfers your wages to your Dutch bank account. This can also be done to a foreign bank account, but it will take longer to get your paycheck.

Employment contract

An employment contract contains the agreements, rights and obligations about your work. That way it is clear to both parties. Sometimes appointments are made verbally. If so, always ask for a written confirmation.

Fairwork.nu

The FairWork foundation focuses on supporting foreign workers in the Netherlands. You can ask them your questions anonymously and free of charge.

Dismissal

If you have been dismissed and find yourself without an income, it is important to find a new job as soon as possible. You can do this, for example, through the <u>UWV</u> (Dutch Employee Insurance Agency), through the European Union website (<u>EURES</u>) or through employment agencies.

If you no longer have a job here, but still live in the Netherlands, you can apply for an <u>unemployment benefit</u> for the time you are out of work. You do this at the UWV, the benefits organization in the Netherlands. You do then have some obligations. For example, to stay in the Netherlands and apply for jobs and keep the UWV informed.







workinnl.nl

When you come to work and live in the Netherlands, a lot is involved. At workinnl.nl you will find explanations of your rights and obligations, what you need to do and what arrangements you need to make. This will help you live and work here safely and healthily. This website also provides a collection of appropriate agencies that can help you with any questions. The website is in Dutch, English, Spanish, Polish, Romanian and Bulgarian.

Housing

It is difficult to get housing in the Netherlands. Rental housing is in high demand, but there are not that many homes for rent. That is why there are waiting lists. You can rent through a corporation or through private rentals. Sometimes your employer will provide housing.

The price for homes for sale is currently high. You must have sufficient income and usually steady employment to take out a mortgage. You also need equity that you have to put in to buy a house.
